IN MEMORY OF MICHAEL C. MORGAN, II

(January 28, 1973 to February 16, 2001)

Michael C. Morgan II, a member of the class of 2001, and a soldier for justice, today, is a memory of courage, strength and determination. After a lengthy illness, Michael's life abruptly ended. Michael touched many lives, and he will never be forgotten. At the UDC David A. Clarke School of Law, he served as Senator to the SBA Student Bar Association), President of BLSA (Black Law Students Association) and Barbri representative. In the summer, he studied abroad at the University of South Africa School of Law at Johannesburg, where he was also a journalist for the African African-American Press. Michael was a study partner, poet, and a friend.

Michael Morgan, graduated cum laude from Winston-Salem State University, with a degree in Political Science. He was also a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. Although Michael died in the last semester of his third year in law school, he was nevertheless awarded the degree of Juris Doctor.
